2021 Strictly Functional Pottery National Exhibition – Jurors’ Statement



We want to start by offering our gratitude to the Strictly Functional Pottery National for giving us the honor and privilege of being the 2021 exhibition jurors. There were so many extraordinary works included in the submission pool, and it was a pleasure to be able to review and select the pieces that resonated the most with each of us.

As individual makers, we jurors have vastly different aesthetics, processes, and find ourselves drawn to very different types of functional objects. We ask very different questions within our ceramic studio practices as we investigate how far we can push the idea of

function, consider what spaces our forms will occupy, and the hands that will use and interact with our work. Regardless of our different approaches, we are all undoubtedly committed to the power functional and utilitarian objects can hold.

The work selected for this exhibition is positively as diverse in nature as its jurors, and as a result, there was no singular theme within our selection process. Instead we found ourselves drawn to exciting surfaces, inventive functional solutions, and well-considered forms that spanned a variety of building and firing processes. With so many high-caliber entries the selection process was very difficult, but in the end the 111 makers included in the exhibition offered refreshing and imaginative solutions to historic and contemporary functionality. We were particularly impressed with the strong union of varying surface techniques with the forms they adorned – some told stories, some paid homage to historical pottery and ornamentation, others were more minimal to exhibit the precision of the forms, but all the surfaces accentuated their form very well.

A sincere thank you to everyone who applied, to those who will be joining us this September, and to the team at SFPN for their hard work facilitating this exhibition. We are very excited to see it all come together and hope our extended community enjoys it as much as we do.

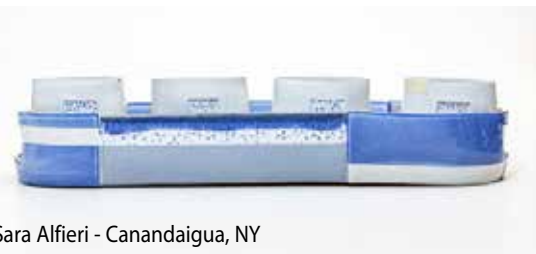

Market House Craft Center is celebrating 29 years of presenting Strictly Functional Pottery National®

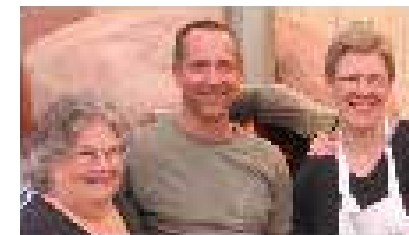

In 1988, it was reorganized into two separate organizations: the Market House Craft Center and Lancaster Designer Craftsmen. The MHCC is a nonprofit [IRS 501(c)3] educational organization whose mission is the encouragement, education and promotion of quality crafts and craftsmanship. Lancaster Designer Craftsmen is an organization of 150 craftspeople and friends of craft.

The purpose of this organization is to encourage and promote Pennsylvania crafts and craftsmen. The MHCC and LDC are totally volunteer organizations. Sixty volunteers work many, many hours to make the Strictly Functional Pottery National® a success every year. JEAN BAILEY LEHMAN
February 24, 1938 - July 10, 2021

It is with great sadness that we announce the loss of Jean Bailey Lehman, who directed SFPN for 17 years. However, it is also with great joy that we celebrate and remember her for everything she did not only for SFPN but for functional pottery in the broader sense. SFPN was created in 1983 by Robert Jones, who turned it over to Jean in 1998. With Jean's skill, vision and care, the show took shape and flourished to become one of the most exciting and prestigious shows in the United States.

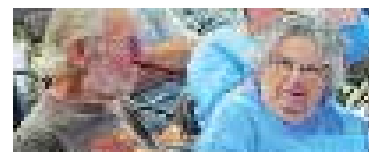
A funeral for herself, Jean understood the special feeling of using beautiful, useful objects. As a mother, she established relationships with those who used her work as the director of SFPN, and established relationships with the artists of the craft and encouraged pottery at every level. Her encouragement for artists was deep and contagious, and she was an impressive collector of the best ceramic artists from all over the country to exhibit their work and outstanding ceramic artists to July 10, 2021.

Those who were fortunate to have known her personally also learned that Jean was an extraordinary person who touched our lives and our families' lives deeply. All of us who have been involved with SFPN over the years have lost a dear friend and we miss her greatly.
